Rear Admiral (E) W. G. Cowland, C.B. (Retd) has been appointed Deputy Chief Engineer, Turbo Charger Department (Gas Turbine Division) of Messrs. D. Napier & Son Ltd.

Rear Admiral Cowland first joined the Company as Naval Consultant in 1951, following his retirement from the Royal Navy, in which he had served since 1908.

Rear Admiral (E) W. K. Weston, O.B.E., was appointed to the Staff of the Commander-in-Chief, Plymouth, on 2nd October, 1954. He was promoted Rear Admiral (E) while serving as Admiralty Engineer Overseer, North Western District, an appointment he held from 1951–53. From 1948–51 he was in charge of the Naval Marine Wing of the National Gas Turbine Establishment at Pyestock.

Captain (E) H. Farquhar Atkins, D.S.O., D.S.C., M.I.Mech.E., is now Assistant Director of Naval Intelligence (Technical).

Captain Sandars spent his early years in submarine appointments, including Chatham Dockyard and as the Engineer Officer of Malta Submarine Flotilla during the War. He led the Anglo-U.S. team which took control of 'U-Boat High Command', and remained in Germany as 'Staff Officer U-Boats' until completion of U-Boat disarmament.

He has since served in E.-in-C.'s Department, on Admiralty Interview Board, as Squadron E.O. (Flotillas) Mediterranean, and in command of H.M.S. Fisgard.

Captain (E) E. J. H. Kirby, D.S.C., who joined the Naval Ordnance Department at Bath as Assistant D.N.O. (Design) in November, 1954, had previously served as the Assistant Engineer-in-Chief (R.D.2). He has held many gunnery engineering appointments during his career, and from 1946 to 1950 was Deputy Superintendent (Naval) at the Admiralty Gunnery Establishment, Teddington. He was the Engineer Officer of H.M.S. Glasgow from 1942 to 1944. In 1944 he joined H.M.S.
