Minutes of Proceedings

OF THE

Annual Meeting

HELD AT THE MINORIES, TOWER HILL, LONDON, E.,

ON FRIDAY, MARCH 31, 1916.

CHAIRMAN: SIR J. FORTESCUE FLANNERY, BART., M.P.

Before proceeding to the large Lecture Hall, where the Annual Meeting was held, Sir Fortescue Flannery, M.P., Past President of the Institute, who presided as chairman in the unavoidable absence of Sir Archibald Denny, retiring President, performed the ceremony of unveiling the *Titanic* Engineers' Memorial, a bronze tablet in bas relief which had been recently fixed in the entrance hall of the Institute, in commemoration of the engineering staff of the *Titanic*, who died at the post of duty. Sir Fortescue Flannery spoke as follows:—

Brother members of the Institute of Marine Engineers, I have been asked on this occasion of our Annual Meeting, and before beginning same, to perform on your behalf and on

my own, the ceremony of unveiling this memorial, which we have erected in what is, perhaps, the most prominent position in our Entrance Hall to the memory of our brothers, who lost their lives in the *Titanic*, now a considerable time ago. remember, as the whole world must remember, the terrible disaster which led to the loss of so many valuable lives. have in no wise forgotten, but our recollection has been perhaps to some degree overcast by the horrors and the loss of life which have occurred since. Men have fallen, giving their lives for their country; they have fallen resignedly, even willingly, knowing that they were doing their duty. But we engineers will ever remain grateful to the memory of these our brothers, who gave their lives in the performance of their duty, as truly performing it and as bravely dying as those valiant men who have died at the front in this terrible war. do not know of any position calling upon more steadfast bravery, coolness and courage than that of the engineer on watch at the moment of disaster, whether by collision or otherwise. we see this tablet, recording the names of those who lost their lives so heroically some three or four years ago, we shall also think of those others who have so recently lost their lives in their country's cause, the engineers of both the Merchant and the Royal Navy, who stood bravely at the post of duty when called upon to do so. So in your name I unveil this memorial -we shall ever cherish the recollection of those whose names it records.

The covering veil was then removed, and the meeting was opened in the Lecture Hall.

The Chairman: I have no speech to make to you, as this is an occasion not for speech-making, but for business. I am exceedingly sorry that our President, Sir Archibald Denny, is not able to be present, and I am sure that he is very sorry himself, because no President of our Institute has more closely attended to his duties or shown more interest in the affairs of the Institute than Sir Archibald Denny, and therefore we are all very sorry that he is not here. We will now proceed to the business before us, the first item being the appointment of scrutineers.

Mr. F. O. Beckett then proposed and Mr. D. Donaldson seconded the appointment of Messrs. E. W. Ross and Wm. Earnshaw, who were agreed to, and accepted.

The CHAIRMAN: The next business is the reading of the Annual Report by our Hon. Secretary.

The Hon. Secretary: Before reading the Annual Report, I am very pleased to announce that we have here with us to-night two of our members from overseas, Mr. Jas. Macdonald from China, and Mr. Wm. Earnshaw from New Zealand, who will each take part in the proceedings. It is very interesting to have at our annual meeting these representatives present with us, and very gratifying to us all to be able to welcome them here to-night. I will now proceed with the Annual Report.

Annual Report.

It is gratifying to note that after a year's experience in our New Premises, the attendance of members has been fairly good, despite the conditions which have prevailed and the demands made by the requirements of the Imperial Service upon all branches of engineering, particularly marine.

Many of our members enlisted in the Land Forces during the earlier stages of the war, a large number have been engaged in the Admiralty, Transport and Auxiliary Services and several are serving in the Royal Navy.

The central situation of the New Premises has made it more convenient for members and visitors to call when in Lordon.

The membership has gradually increased, and at the close of the Financial Year, on January 31st, 1916, it stood as follows:—

The sympathy of the Institute has been expressed to the relatives of these members, several of whom have fallen in the Imperial Service as noted in the obituary paragraphs.

AWARDS.—The following subjects were set for Papers or Essays, but only two were competed for as note?—

Sea-going Members (Sir Archibald Denny's Award).—Subject, "Hints and deductions from practical experience, which may be useful towards improving ship and engine design. Reports upon consumption of coal and/or water per I.H.P. per hour" was not competed for.

Associate Members.—Subject, "The Sequence of Cranks in multiple expansion engines and the balancing of powers" was also not competed for.

Associates.—Subject, "Nominal, Indicated, Brake and Shaft Horse Power, how ascertained and their relation to one another," won by "Tea Kettle" (Mr. James Watt, Graduate), value awarded £2.

Graduates.—Subject, "The Thrust Shaft. Its relation to the work and the power transmitted. Design of an ideal thrust block, with description of details," 1, Mr. C. P. Tanner (Helix), award value £2; 2, Mr. D. Langharne-Thornton (Alexr. Gewain), award value £1.

Open Competition.—"The Refrigerator. Different systems and their adaptability for various services on shipboard," not competed for.

LLOYI'S REGISTER SCHOLARSHIPS.—No examination was held during 1915, as most of the engineering apprentices, for whose benefit the scholarship was intended, are engaged on National Service. As it was decided to postpone the examination for these scholarships during the war, the amount of the scholarship, viz., £50 per annum for two years, has therefore, with the approval of Lloyd's Register, been held over in the interim allowing the scholarships to accumulate, and the names of accepted candidates have meantime been retained.

JUNIOR SECTION.—The room set apart for the Junior Section is open for the use of Graduates and Associates, books, magazines, models, &c., being provided specially for their service.

THE LIBRARY AND READING ROOM have been maintained for the service of visitors, and are available during the day or evening hours. The list of books, papers, and magazines is given on a following page.

PAPERS AND DISCUSSIONS.—The programme of the Session with dates and other details is given on a following page. Nine papers have been contributed during the Session.

REPRESENTATIVES.—The Chairman of Council was nominated by the Council to serve on the Committee in connection with the Advisory Council, appointed by the Board of Education for Industrial and Scientific Research, of which Sir Wm. McCormack is Chairman. Mr. J. Shanks was nominated to represent the Institute on the Advisory Committee of the Board of Trade, to succeed Mr. Joseph Hallett. The Board of Trade desired the Council of the Institute to express an opinion on the formulation of a more definite basis for the calculation of Nominal Horse Power than is at present in use, and the matter is still under consideration. Mr. Alexr. Boyle has been appointed as our representative on the Committee formed by the Institute of Metals to conduct Research Work on the corrosion of metals. Mr. J. S. Blackett, Member at San Francisco, was appointed to attend the International Engineering Congress at San Francisco, September 20/25, 1915.

THE TRANSACTIONS have been issued to members each month containing papers and discussions, selected essays and other engineering matter of special interest. Bound volumes have been supplied to Libraries and kindred Societies (with whom Transactions are exchanged) and also to members and others who require them in this form,

THE "TITANIC" ENGINEERING STAFF MEMORIAL FUND.—The privileges of this Fund, which provides for the admission of an orphan to the Royal Merchant Seamen's Orphanage, at Snaresbrook, was not taken advantage of this Session, as no eligible case was submitted. The sum of £80 was, however, contributed to the Orphanage, as formerly arranged. Members who know suitable cases are requested to report these to the Committee.

The Council, in appreciation of Lord Fisher's work in the Royal Navy and his efforts to obtain a higher recognition of the Marine Engineer, elected His Lordship an Hon. Member of the

Institute. An address on vellum was presented to him by the Council, signed by the President, past Presidents, Chairman and Hon. Secretary of the Institute. A facsimile of the letter of acceptance received from Lord Fisher appeared in the April issue of Transactions. The original of this letter and a facsimile of the address are framed and can be seen in the Library.

In the early part of the year, in order to render some little assistance to the country in a time of national crisis, the Council offered to place the whole of the Institute Premises at the disposal of the Admiralty, and subsequently of the War Office, for use as a Hospital, or for other official purposes.

The Assistant-Secretary, Mr. Norman Stewart, is still serving as Serjeant in the Seaforth Highlanders, and has now been at the Front for six months.

The members will realise that the expenses connected with the City Premises are necessarily greater than they were at Stratford, and while every endeavour is being made towards economy, consistent with the work of the Institute, the Council invite the co-operation of every member to increase the membership in every way possible.

OBITUARY NOTICES.

George Amor (Member) who died in October, 1914, at home, after undergoing a severe operation, was for some time employed in his father's business at Limekiln Dry Dock, London, and after the business was given up, was connected for a time with a coal agency in the Richmond district, subsequently, and for three or four years previous to his death, Mr. Amor acted as General Manager to the Kattendyk Engineering and Ship Repairing Works at Antwerp. He became a member of the Institute in 1911.

EDWIN BETHELL (Member) entered the service of the P. & O. S.N. Co. in 1888, becoming Chief Engineer in 1898. During the Boer War he was on active service, doing transport work. He subsequently became chief engineer of the SS. Calcdonia, and his name is associated with the record runs of that vessel in carrying the Indian mails. He remained on her when she was chartered for pleasure cruises in the Mediterranean and the North Sea. Mr. Bethell, who served 34 years with the P. & O., was afterwards appointed to the *India*, and took up a commission when this boat was transferred to Government service as an auxiliary cruiser. The India was unfortunately torpedoed in neutral waters in the North Sea, on August 8th, 1915, and Mr. Bethell was among those who lost their lives in the service. He was 54 years of age, and was elected a member of the Institute in 1895. One of his sons is in the service of Messrs. White & Co., the other enlisted in the 20th County of London Regiment now at the front.

ARCHIBALD BLAIR (Member) who died suddenly at his residence in London on the 18th December, 1915, aged 75, was the third son of Captain A. Blair, for many years captain of the R.N.Y.C. commodore's yacht Orion. He served his apprenticeship in Messrs. Scott's Foundry, Greenock, and afterwards worked in Messrs. Rankin & Blackmore's. During his sea experience and while he was chief engineer, he was engaged in a steamer running the blockade during the American war. His last steamer was the Scotland (Messrs. Temperley). He was appointed from this ship as manager to Messrs. Lester & Perkins, Royal Albert Dock, and after thirteen years with this firm he received the appointment of superintendent Engineer to the Anglo-American Oil Co., Ltd., retiring in 1904. During this

period, the SS. Narragansett and other tank steamers were designed and constructed under his supervision. Mr. Blair was also a member of the Institute of Naval Architects. He was twice married, his second wife surviving him.

C. H. Boddey (Member).—The name of C. H. Boddey is another of our members added to the Empire's tragic roll of honour. Mr. Boddey, who became a member of the Institute in 1911, was standing by in the Fairfield Shipyard during the building of the SS. Heliopolis, afterwards the Royal George, and sailed in that vessel as second engineer on her maiden voyage. He was subsequently promoted to chief engineer on the SS. Cairo, afterwards the ill-fated Royal Edward, and was amongst those who lost their lives when she was torpedoed on the 14th August, 1915. His loss is much regretted by his Company, who esteemed him as a thoroughly efficient engineer officer. Our deepest sympathy is extended to Mrs. Boddey and to the other members of his family.

ALEXANDER BROWN (Member) who died on the 11th March, 1915, was born at Leith, January, 1836, and was educated at the Normal School Edinburgh. He served an apprenticeship with his father as a blacksmith at Queensferry, and afterwards as an engineer with Messrs. Morton, Leith. His sea experience was gained in steamers engaged in the North Sea, Baltic, and White Sea trades, and he obtained his chief engineer's certificate in 1864. A few years later he settled at Southampton in the employment of Messrs. Day, Summers & Co., as leading hand and outside foreman. In 1876 he received the appointment of Supt. Engineer to the Isle of Wight Steam Packet Co., from the activities of which he retired in 1910, but retained his connection with the Company as consulting engineer. When the Southampton members of the Institute had a centre where papers were read and a library and reading room were in operation, Mr. Brown was an active supporter of it. He was elected a member of the Institute in 1894.

Major H. R. Chapman (Member) who was killed in action in France on the 27th June, 1915, was the eldest son of the late Captain Abel H. Chapman (19th Hussars), Chairman-Director of Messrs. Clarke, Chapman & Co., Gateshead. Major Chapman was educated at Uppingham, and entered the Company's works in the year 1891, becoming a director in 1893. He was keenly interested in a Volunteer Corps—largely composed of men of the works—the 1st Durham Royal Engineers, and of

which he became Major, resigning with that rank on leaving Gateshead. He became a member of this Institute in 1911. He was also a member of the North East Coast Institution of Engineers and of the Institution of Naval Architects. On the outbreak of war, Major Chapman volunteered his services, and he was appointed Major of the 10th Battalion Durham Light Infantry Force, which was sent out to France in May, 1915. He leaves a widow and three daughters.

Joseph Conner (Member) died on the 16th March, 1915, after a long illness, at the early age of 42. He served his apprenticeship with the Central Marine Engineering Works, West Hartlepool, gaining experience in the yard and drawing office and also in the repairing shop. He served the firm of Messrs. L. R. Conner & Co. for twenty years, acting as third, second, and chief engineer respectively, and finally during the last six years as superintendent engineer. He was well known and much esteemed in West Hartlepool. His widow survives him.

A. H. GIFFEN (Member) who joined the Institute in 1904, was born and educated at Campbeltown. After serving his apprenticeship and gaining some further experience on shore, he joined the service of the British India S.N. Co., and after being on the Indian Coast for some years he was appointed to a steamer on the home line, and was second engineer of the Waipara, also of the Dilwara. He returned to the Indian Coast and sailed as chief engineer. He was in the Catherine Apcar, and sailed from Bombay to Basra; on the return voyage he was lost overboard on December 26th, 1915, to the great regret of his many friends.

Stanley Hogg (Associate), whose death from heart failure, took place at Aden on the 19th September, 1915, was born at Gravesend in April, 1872. His apprenticeship was served with Messrs. Denny Bros., of Dumbarton, and at its termination he entered the employment of the B.I.S.N. Company, in whose service he remained to the last. He was chief engineer of the SS. Okara when his death took place. The end was undoubtedly accelerated by the frequent attacks of malaria from which he had suffered for many years. He was a son of the late Captain Hogg, who was much esteemed and well known as a pilot for many years on the Thames.

George S. Knight (Member) who died suddenly on October 16th, 1915, was elected a member in 1912. He was the head of

the firm of Messrs. Mills & Knight, whose dry dock and repairing works are on the banks of the Thames. He served his apprenticeship with his father, who was one of the founders of the firm, and subsequently became manager. He was a Justice of the Peace, City of London, and took an active interest in religious and philanthropic work. He was highly esteemed in the business circle within which he was associated.

George P. Lee (Member) was born at Christchurch, New Zealand, served his apprenticeship and was educated there. His parents were farmers, and were associated with the early coaching days of the Colony. Mr. Lee came to England in the later eighties, serving with Messrs. Shaw Saville, Watt Watts and other companies. He gained his extra first-class Board of Trade certificate in 1901, being one of the first three colonials to attain this grade. He filled various shore appointments, serving with the B.T.H. Turbine Department, and with the Westminster Electric Supply, Horseferry Road Station. was also engineer-director of the Harvey Electro-Chemical Co., and at the time of his death was engineer-manager to the Auto-Vacuum Refrigerating Co., Ltd. Mr. Lee became a member of the Institute in 1906, and was also an Associate-Member of the Institute of Civil Engineers, and of the Electrical Engineers. His death is deeply deplored, and much sympathy is felt with his widow and four young children, how have since returned to New Zealand.

Mr. Wm. G. McIntyre (Member) died at Largs (Ayreshire) on the 25th July, 1915, five days after his arrival from Australia where he had been living twelve months in order to recuperate his health. His last most cherished wish, to die in the home of his boyhood, was thus fulfilled. He had served as a volunteer through the South African campaign and had contracted lung trouble which caused him to be more or less of an invalid since that time.

Mr. McIntyre's apprenticeship was served with Messrs. Scott & Co., Ltd., of Greenock; his sea service extended over a period of about six years, and he subsequently became engineer in charge to Messrs. Mackenzie & Co., of Tientsin. He had been a member of the Institute since 1911.

Archibald Campbell Morgan (Member) who joined the Institute in 1909, was born at Campbeltown in 1883. He was educated at the Grammar School there, and served his apprenticeship with The London & Glasgow Shipbuilding Co., Ltd. Mr. Morgan joined the British India Steam Navigation Co. in

1904, on the transport *Dunera*, afterwards serving on several of their steamers, chiefly on the Indian Coast. He obtained his chief engineer's certificate in Glasgow at the age of 23. His death, which took place at Alexandria, Egypt, on the 20th June, 1915, at the early age of 32, is much regretted. He was second engineer of the SS. *Umeta* at the time.

F. W. PENDER (Member) who joined the Institute in 1914, served his apprenticeship with Messrs. Cosens & Co., Ltd., of Weymouth, on the conclusion of which he joined the service of the P. & O. S. N. Co., afterwards transferring to Messrs. J. Jacobs & Co., of Cardiff, then to the Elder Dempster Line and the Canadian Pacific Co., passing steadily upward to the grade of chief engineer. He was acting as assistant engineer, R.N.R. on Admiralty service when he was killed at sea on the 31st October, 1915, while in the discharge of his duty.

Walter John Rigby (Associate) joined the Institute in 1910. He was serving as Sub-Lieut.-Engineer, R.N.R., on H.M.S. No. 3 Special Service Squadron, when he was killed on duty, on the 31st May, 1915, by the bursting of a steam valve. Mr. Rigby served his apprenticeship at Messrs. Clover, Clayton & Co., Birkenhead. Of a cheery and happy disposition, he was greatly liked by all who knew him, and his loss is deeply deplored by a large circle of relatives and friends. He was unmarried.

ROBERT JARDINE WALKER (Graduate).—It is with regret that the name of this promising Graduate is placed on the list. He was killed in action in France at the age of 24. He had always been interested in military training and service, and joined the Air Line Co. of the Glasgow Engineers as a private. four years ago he passed into the special reserve of officers, and was attached as lieutenant to the Second Gordon Highlanders. On the outbreak of war, he was sent to Aberdeen, where he did excellent service in training men. He was sent to France in January, 1915, and was soon after promoted to captain. going through some of the heaviest fighting he was killed instantaneously by a shell whilst leading his men in the attack on the Germans near Hooge, on the 25th September, 1915. Captain Walker was mentioned by his commanding officer as "a great loss to the regiment, a most capable officer, and a great favourite with all." He joined the Institute as a Graduate in 1910, being at that time apprentice to Messrs. David Rowan & Co., of Glasgow, and gained awards for essays contributed in the Graduate section. He also stood well for the Lloyd's Register Scholarship in the competitive examination.

The Hon. Treasurer: In presenting the accounts and balance sheet, it is also desirable to read the letter from the Chartered Accountants, as it gives a good idea of some of the special features worthy of attention and careful consideration. The letter is as follows:—

The Increase in Revenue—£77 0s. 5d. taken from the Increase in Expenditure—£799 10s. 11d. gives the figure—£722 10s. 6d. mentioned in the second paragraph.

The causes for the increase in the Expenditure are:-

- The fact that the Institute is now in possession of the City Premises.
- 2. The payment of full salary to the Assistant Secretary while absent on Foreign Service, and the extra payments necessary to keep his work going.
- 3. Repairs and alterations to the Stratford Property.
- 4. Interest on Bank Loan.

The whole of the City Premises Fund has now been merged into the Institute Accounts.

The Furniture, Electric Fittings and Books in Library, at 31st January, 1916, are in accordance with a valuation recently made for Insurance purposes by Messrs. Henry Langston & Co.

The Institute hold a sum of £22 4s. 4d. belonging to the *Titanic* Memorial Fund. We have drawn up a Revenue Account of this Fund from its inception, and a Balance Sheet as at the 31st January, 1916. As there is a separate banking account for this Fund we would suggest that the £22 4s. 4d. be paid over to that account, and all future receipts and payments made through it.

The Investments remain at the market prices on the 31st January, 1913, subsequent Investments appearing at cost.

We have inspected the Title Deeds of the Freehold Property and the Lease of the City Premises, and have verified the Investments and the Balances at the Bank.

We have obtained all the information and explanations we have required. In our opinion the Balance Sheet of your Institute has been properly drawn up so as to exhibit a true and correct view of the state of the Institute's affairs according to the best of our information and the explanations given us and as shown by the books of the Institute.

Hon. Treasurer: Amongst the special points to which I would like to make further reference are one or two of the larger amounts which represent the costs of working as compared with former years at Stratford: Ground rent accounts for £319 11s. 8d., and rates and taxes amount to £195 19s. 9d. In regard to the latter, after discussion with the assessment authorities, we obtained a separate assessment for the basement distinct from the portion actually occupied by the Institute, and as long as the basement remains unlet we are free from the poor rate on it and also for half the general district rate.

I also wish to draw attention to the investments of the Institute. As mentioned by the accountants, these are still valued in the balance sheet at the 1913 figures, which are, of course, much higher than could be obtained at the present time if they had to be disposed of. Most of the stocks are subject to the official minimum, and if this were removed they would probably be somewhat lower still, so that even the official minimum prices would not give a correct value. We all hope that the values will recover, and there is every prospect that they will do so, and if members keep present conditions in mind they can easily see what is the actual position in regard to the investments.

The loan from the bank also calls for comment. The amount subscribed for the new premises was short of the actual cost by about £2,500, and the loan of £2,000, as shown by the balance sheet, has been increased by £500 to clear off the final payments. Under the war conditions prevailing when the premises were completing it was undesirable to move for further subscriptions, but the matter of making an effort to clear off the bank loan might very well be taken up now, and I hope the Council, during the coming year will devise some plan to this end.

The letting of the basement should produce an income of about £200 per annum, and this, coupled with rigid economies in management, should quite relieve the financial position.

It will further be noted that it was necessary to spend £100 on repairs and alterations to the Stratford premises in accordance with our agreement with the tenants.

I should also mention that the sum of £12 1s. 4d., a credit balance from the dinner account of a former year, should have been added to the City Premises Fund, as decided at last Annual Meeting, instead of being carried forward as shown.

Mr. James MacDonald: I have much pleasure in advising the adoption of the reports of the Hon. Secretary and Hon. Treasurer, to whom we are indebted for the full details given. The expenditure has been somewhat large, but I hope that with the dawn of better times we may get the balance re-adjusted. We must all put our shoulders to the wheel and endeavour to increase all grades of the membership. It is unfortunate that the basement is still unlet, but in happier days there should be no difficulty in letting it.

Mr. Farenden: I have pleasure in seconding the adoption of the reports. Although our first year's financial experience from the financial point of view since our location here has not been so successful as desired, this has been explained. Well, we must all do what we can to increase the membership, and also endeavour to sublet the basement and thus increase our revenue. There is still about £2,500 required to complete the purchase of our new building. The present time may not be quite opportune to make appeals for money, but if a committee were formed to deal with the subject I feel sure it would have the desired effect. I have much pleasure in sceonding the adoption of the reports.

The CHAIRMAN: I invite members to add any further remarks or questions. I, myself, would like to say that there seems to me, in the very clear, lucid, and comprehensive statements laid before us, recording the general business of the Institute, including the finances, no cause for discouragement or any reason to suppose that we, as an Institute, did not make the right decision when we decided to come to Tower Hill from Stratford. The facts of the history of the Institute all confirm, as it seems to me, the wisdom of the course which we then decided to take. In regard to the essays, I am sorry that no less than three of the prizes were not competed for. The subjects for these essays are most skilfully chosen, it seems to me, not only in view of the subjects themselves, but because anyone who began to write a paper on these subjects must necessarily make extensive re-I venture to say that there is not an engineer who could write many pages on these subjects without very considerable reference to authorities and text books. I hope the Council will take note of what I say; if there is anything I can do in assisting to secure competition in connection with these subjects I am ready to do it. It is the duty of everyone in the Institute to cooperate, and I will not shrink from my duty. The finances of the Institute also appear to me to be quite satisfactory, but with

regard to the investments of the Institute in first-class stocks to which the Hon. Treasurer has already referred, I would like to lay stress on one point. When a private individual has made an investment, he is entitled to watch very carefully and with serious concern any depreciation or appreciation of the market value, because in his lifetime he may require to realise the money. But with an Institute it is somewhat different. An Institute runs on for many more years, and therefore I re-echo very heartily the remark of our Hon. Treasurer that we should hope that the depreciation would right itself, and I think myself, that in the course of a very few years the value of these first-class gilt edged securities will recover itself, and we shall be able to regard them as valuable as they are shown on the balance sheet, and there is no reason for depreciating them or writing them down.

Mr. A. Boyle: I have much pleasure in proposing a vote of thanks to Sir Archibald Denny. He has been President during two very important years in the history of the Institute, and during that period he has identified himself with the progress, working, and building up of the Institute, and the building is indeed one which the Marine Engineers of the Empire may be proud to call their very own. Sir Archibald belongs to a family whose members are not only able business men and great shipbuilders, but men who have proved themselves worthy in other respects to be the citizens of this great Empire, ready and willing to take their share in assisting the progress, political and social, of the Empire. We are all of us proud to uphold the sacred cause of liberty and right against the brutal forces of tyranny and oppression, and I cannot refrain from mentioning that Sir Archibald Denny has three sons at the front fighting The name of Denny will always be closely for the country. associated with the Institute, and commemorated by the gifts they have bestowed. The Denny family has given us four admirable presidents, and I think it is unique in the history of any Institute to have two sons and a nephew of the same family on the presidential roll, and it may be that at some future annual meeting, younger men than I am may move a vote of thanks to the then retiring president, who may belong to another generation of the Denny family. I move a very hearty vote of thanks to Sir Archibald Denny.

Mr. Campbell: I have very much pleasure in seconding this vote of thanks, and to concur very heartily in all that Mr. Boyle

has said, and can only add that I hope that the generations of the Denny family will be long spared and continue to afford us their valuable services.

The Chairman: The relations with the Denny family are of the most gratifying to everyone connected with the Institute.

Mr. Wells: It is my privilege to voice the general appreciation of the members of the Institute for the office bearers and Council. The period covered is clouded with war troubles; duties and responsibilities have arisen which are entirely new and exceedingly heavy. The balance sheet is a very trenchant argument and illustration of the present situation; the duties of the Council are only known to those who have served in this position, and only they can appreciate the real work and responsibilities involved. I therefore have pleasure in proposing a hearty vote of thanks to the Office Bearers and Council for their untiring attention to their duties, and I hope our gratitude will cheer them on their way.

Mr. Turpin: I have much pleasure in seconding this vote of thanks. The Office Bearers and Council have had a most anxious year, much more so than in ordinary times. The report and statement of accounts shows how well they carried out their work. I think also that the explanation of the Treasurer helps us considerably, and I feel sure that all will come right in time. It has occurred to me that this hall is a very fine room. I may perhaps suggest that some money might be obtained by letting it. I do not think I have any more remarks to make. I have much pleasure in seconding the vote of thanks to the Office Bearers and Council.

Mr. George Adams: On behalf of the Office Bearers and other members of the Council I have to thank you for your vote of appreciation and thanks for the efforts they have put forth during the past year. This year, to each and every one, has been a strenuous one on account of this terrible war, which in many ways has hindered the working of the Institute and restricted the attendance, but notwithstanding present conditions and the inevitable ebb and flow to which all Institutions are liable, we have a net increase of membership of 85. This, in itself, is a good feature, and may be taken as an encouragement after the first year's working in the new premises, but now that we are fairly established here, it is incumbent upon each and all to do their best to further the objects of the Institute and make known its advantages among Marine Engineers for

whose benefit it was founded, so that there may be a continually growing membership. The Treasurer's report may not appear as well as we could wish; but we must bear in mind that it is mainly on account of our new undertaking, and entering upon it under adverse circumstances already referred to; no doubt the Council will consider later on what steps can be taken to clear off the remaining debt on the premises. It would not be considered a wise policy to part with our investments at the present juncture, and we may reasonably hope that they will recover their full value in due course, moreover, any revenue they produce is required to assist in defraying working expenses.

I would take this opportunity of again mentioning that at a period during the past year when circumstances appeared that it might be of some service to the country, the Council offered this building to the Admiralty or the War Office as a hospital, and although it was found that the accommodation was not necessary, the members of the Institute have the satisfaction of knowing that the offer was made.

You have heard from our Hon. Secretary the details of the work of the Institute during the past year, and which we have endeavoured to do our best to carry on. Again thanking you for your appreciation, we express the hope that the work begun so many years ago at Stratford will be brought to a full success in our new home.

Mr. Ruck Keene: I have much pleasure in asking you to give a very hearty vote of thanks to Mr. Archer. I do not think that many of you realise the amount of work that he has done for the Institute. He has given us great assistance, more especially in connection with these new premises, and the valuable advice he gave has been very useful to members of Council. I have very great pleasure in asking you to give a hearty vote of thanks to Mr. Archer, and ask him to accept the appointment of Hon. Solicitor for the next Session.

Mr. Hawthorn: It gives me pleasure to endorse the vote of thanks put to the meeting on behalf of our Hon. Solicitor. There have been times when we have been in want of legal advice. For instance, when removing into the new premises many legal points had to be considered, and Mr. Archer was always ready to give us his valuable assistance. I think, therefore, we cannot do better than request him to retain the office he has so ably filled. I have great pleasure, therefore, in seconding this vote of thanks.

Mr. Mather: I have very much pleasure in asking you to accord a hearty vote of thanks to our Hon. Auditors, for their duties are really very serious ones. Our accounts, as you are aware, are examined officially as required by law, but the Hon. Auditors have always responded most generously whenever I have asked them to come forward and assist us, and they have helped us most materially by their advice and suggestions on many points, especially during the past year. I therefore ask you to join with me in a very hearty vote of thanks to Messrs. J. Clark and A. Robertson, our Hon. Auditors.

The Hon. Secretary: I have much pleasure in seconding this vote of thanks proposed by our Hon. Treasurer, which I endorse most heartily; as a matter of fact, although termed Honorary Auditors, they do real good work for the Institute.

Mr. A. Robertson: Mr. Clark and myself have done our best to perform the necessary duties in connection with the auditing, but Messrs. West & Drake have made our duties considerably easier, owing to the very exhaustive way they have gone into the accounts. You have seen that the balance sheet shows an increase in the annual expenses in the region of £450. has been made up by the three principal items shown in the accounts, viz., working expenses, repairs to Stratford premises, and removal expenses. We hope shortly to add to our income by letting the basement, as you are aware. There is one other point I should like to mention, the fact that these premises are leasehold property, and we consider it ought very shortly to be taken into account to provide a sinking fund, either by a special fund, or taking out an insurance, so that at the end of the term of the lease the Institute may have the realisation of the full value of the property. Then of course, the question of the overdraft at the bank is a serious item, but if we all put our shoulders to the wheel, I have no doubt that within the next two or three years it might be cleared off. We mention these things specifically because we think that if members knew the position of affairs, they would all be ready to help by increasing the membership. I do not mean, of course, to imply that the affairs of the Institute are not on a sound basis, but I take it for granted that we all want to be clear of debt. I thank you for the vote of thanks to Mr. Clark and myself.

Mr. E. W. Ross: Mr. Wm. Earnshaw and myself have gone through the names on the voting papers, and he will now announce the names of the members elected in alphabetical order.

Mr. W. EARNSHAW: We have to report as follows:

President: Sir James Mills, K.C.M.G.

Hon. Treasurer: Mr. A. H. Mather. Hon. Secretary: Mr. Jas. Adamson.

Members of Council: Messrs. Arthur Blackburn, John Clark, Jas. Peacock, Jas. Shanks, Jas. E. Wimshurst.

It gives me a great deal of pleasure to be back here again with you after many years, and I am very glad to note the progress of the Institute both in regard to membership and the acquisition of these new beautiful premises. I believe that I am the only member of the Australasian Institute of Marine Engineers here present, and I have the honour to bring you their fraternal greetings, especially from the New Zealand branch.

It would be a good step forward if a closer union existed between the British and Australasian Institutes of Marine Engineers. This welding of the two bodies may come in time, and will, I think, be productive of a great deal of good, technical and social, to marine engineering in general, and the members in particular. I make the suggestion that the new Council keep this union in view.

Before this amalgamation of interests can be thoroughly useful, it will be necessary that the numerical strengths of both bodies approach the maximum of the sea-going engineers, and while the membership has increased greatly during late years, yet a greater advance is absolutely necessary now.

Past Councils have done yeoman service, but speaking generally, individual members are apathetic regarding its growth and aims. The Institute here can well take a lesson from our brethern overseas, where each member is keenly interested in the affairs of their Institute. Our annual expenditure, due to these new premises, has largely increased; our income is dependent almost wholly upon members' annual subscriptions, thus in order that the balance can be struck up the right side of the ledger it is essential that the membership be considerably strengthened.

I would express the hope that the coming years will show the Institute greatly increased in usefulness, and that we may welcome in the near future a good and useful battalion of new and efficient members due to some good recruiting scheme, which no doubt the Council will father.

The Chairman: We are greatly obliged to the Scrutineers for the trouble they have taken and for their valuable services. Members of Council represent a very important section of our work, and are most of them consulting or superintending engineers of reputation and experience. I must ask you all to excuse me if I, most reluctantly, leave the meeting now, as I have a railway journey of 40 and a motor ride of 20 miles before I reach home, and you know that attesting is not the only duty imposed on married men. Let me add that I wish to say how much I appreciate the honour you have done me in asking me to take the place of Sir Archibald Denny here to-night. I have been most happy to place my poor services at the disposal of this Institute which has done so much for me and to which I shall always be grateful and desirous of showing my gratitude.

Mr. GEO. Adams at this stage occupied the chair.

The Hon. Secretary: The next item on our programme is recommendations and suggestions. An opportunity is now given to members to put their ideas forward for the Council to deal with, and we shall be glad to hear those who will take advantage of it.

Mr. P. T. CAMPBELL: The opportunities come to us on these occasions when some of us want to say something. What to me, as a member of Council, appears to be a very serious matter, is that we have a debt of fully £2,000, and what we have got to do is to have it worked off by this time next year.

We have 1,500 members of all grades, and if everyone would double his subscription for the time being we should soon work it off. Then there is the question of the advisability of changing some members of Council every year; many of our members take a deep interest in their work, but unfortunately they have got to go out after a certain period; in a commercial company that would be a disaster. I do not however forget that it is necessary to have new blood sometimes. I also suggest that it might be a good thing to resurrect the old City Premises' Committee, for until we can show a good balance on the right side in the Treasurer's report we cannot be said to be in a satisfactory position. I want to get the opinion of members as to what is the best way to deal with the situation.

Mr. J. Clark: I think we might introduce some system of compounding; if we had such a system the fees might give us this £2,000, or a good proportion of it. Another suggestion is as to the first annual subscriptions; I believe it is the

case that members pay the first fee pro rata; I suggest that this should be altered and the full fee paid.

- Mr. A. Robertson: I agree with what Mr. Campbell has said, and if individual members can be induced to pay an extra guinea this year it would be a very good thing; but I do not think we should make a levy on them; it must be purely voluntary; but seeing that we have such fine premises, is there any reason why the suggestion of increasing the subscription to $1\frac{1}{2}$ guineas should not be considered? We are getting full value for our money; Marine Engineers are doing well at present, and we certainly ought to be able to wipe out this debt without calling on anybody to make undue sacrifices.
- Mr. J. Shanks: I am very pleased that Mr. Campbell has raised the question of finance. I have had the privilege of being a Vice-President during the past year, and have been exercised in my own mind on finding what our financial position is, and I think it is our duty to realise it. We have got to wipe off that debt as soon as possible. We are prosperous as a body, and most of us are well able to give a contribution. Some members are able to give two guineas or more, but a great many cannot do so. I hope members will be induced to give voluntarily.

Mr. Chisholm: I agree with Mr. Shanks. To increase the fee would not tend to induce engineers to become members, and instead of doing anything to keep them away it would be better to do something to bring increasing numbers. There are a great many men who are not in a position to give two guineas, but I heartily support the idea that all should give what they

can voluntarily.

Mr. W. McLaren: I am sorry to hear such pessimistic utterances to-night. I do not see anything alarming in the situation. We have done very well on the whole. The Council has been excellent. There is nobody belonging to this Institute who has done more for the welfare of Marine Engineers and to create and foster a feeling of fraternity with our brethern in the Colonies than our Hon. Secretary. Let us all do what we can to help.

Mr. Balfour: Mr. Campbell's remarks have impressed me, and must have impressed you, but I heartily endorse the Treasurer's optimistic words and believe that the investments will rapidly improve. I do not think it would be advisable to apply to those outside the Institute; it would be much more to our credit to depend on ourselves.

Mr. Hawthorn: I think that every individual member, associate-member, or graduate ought to do his very best to bring in a new member of his own grade. Speaking from an experience of 27 years in this Institute and 19 in the Council, and looking through the application forms time after time, I find practically the same names as proposers, showing that some of us have been doing our utmost; but it is incumbent on every one to bring some of his friends in. This is my view, and I hope you will all take it to heart.

Mr. AITKEN Brown: I was under the impression that the report and the balance sheet had been passed unanimously. We are indebted to Mr. Campbell for his suggestion, but I should advise him to propose that the Council nominate a small Committee to liquidate this debt—but it must be voluntary.

Mr. Campbell: I was not aware that I had said anything to make members suppose that the call for money was to be enforced. The most practical suggestion has come from Mr. Aitken Brown; a member might be nominated outside the Council—a member who would like to work for the Institute, and then let us get started with it.

Mr. Chisholm: I second Mr. Aitken Brown's proposal.

Mr. E. W. Ross: Unless we can increase our membership we shall always be behind—that is to say unable to advance; as everyone who has had anything to do with societies realises, there are always a number of expenses over and above the rates and taxes. Our membership has increased this year by 85 net, 100 new members. This is a long way from the 500 we require. Let us employ means to increase our membership.

Mr. Hawthorn: If it is your wish that it should be a resolution coming from this Annual Meeting, let it stand that it should be incumbent on every member to introduce a member. It ought to be more widely known that the Institute is working very hard and doing excellent work for its members. The value of the Institute to Marine Engineers is enormous, and therefore it is the duty of every individual member to increase the membership. We have constituted ourselves the guardians of the young engineer; although we do not adopt the methods of Trade Unionism, our efforts are always directed to further the interests of Marine Engineers. No class of men has served the country in the crisis better than the Marine Engineer, and when a disaster occurs he is usually at his post 30 to 40 feet

below deck, and has the least chance of being saved. I would call upon all members of the Institute to support the Institute and bring in as many new members as possible.

Mr. A. O. RICHARDSON: I heartily endorse the plan of bringing in new members. I think that if the senior engineers of steamships would use their influence, it might have a very marked effect. We here are doing our best, but our range is rather restricted. I suggest that some notice might appear in the Transactions in relation to this; also, an appeal might be made to shipowners, who, more than anyone else, are indebted for much of their success to the efforts of the Marine Engineer.

Mr. A. Robertson: It is certain that some plan must be formulated. We have increased annual expenses and the question of forming a sinking fund must also be considered.

Mr. Turpin: A great deal can be done by spreading the Transactions, from which an increase of membership has already largely come. If we distribute them among our friends the result will be automatic.

The CHAIRMAN: Mr. Brown's resolution is: "That the Council be asked to appoint a small Committee or adopt some measures to liquidate the debt by voluntary contributions from members, or by other ways and means, as may be deemed advisable." I do not think the Council can make it obligatory upon each member to introduce a new member as Mr. Hawthorn suggests, but I have no doubt that each one will do his best in this direction. Apropos of Mr. Campbell's remark anent the City Premises Committee I would point out that as a member of it, together with Mr. Campbell, the Committee having seen the building completed and opened, considered that the work—for which they as a Committee were formed was duly accomplished, and we then merged the business into the hands of the Council, much regretting that during that period we were not able to raise the whole of the money and so open the Institute free of debt. We should all be pleased to see this incubus removed, and I therefore put the resolution to the meeting.

The Resolution was carried unanimously.

The Hon. Treasurer: Mr. Campbell has done a good service in raising this discussion, but I should not like anyone to go away with the idea that there is need for anything more than the natural dissatisfaction of knowing that the premises are not free of debt. There is no ground for pessimism or anxiety.

If we had not had sufficient security to offer, the Bank would not have increased the loan as they have done within the last few days. We must not consider the increase in the working expenses as a matter for anxiety, as this was of course expected in the new premises, and I have already shown that the deficit on the year's working is more than covered by the interest on the debt, the probable income from letting the basement and certain reductions in the clerical expenses.

Mr. Campbell: It has been my pleasure to work with Mr. Hawthorn for many years, and I wish every member would take the same interest in the Institute as he does. I should be very glad if any member, instead of giving two guineas, would bring two new members.

Mr. W. McLaren: I have pleasure in moving a vote of thanks to Sir Fortescue Flannery; also to Mr. Adams for taking the chair. We are all only too pleased to give all the help and assistance we can to advance the work of the Institute and back up the efforts of the executive. I have great pleasure in proposing this vote of thanks to Mr. Adams, who has been here so often and has always given us his best attention and service.

Mr. A. O. Richardson: I have very great pleasure in seconding.

Mr. George Adams: I have to thank you for this vote of thanks, due first to Sir Fortescue Flannery, as he was the Chairman of this meeting, and when he had to leave us I simply filled the place as a matter of duty.
