# Forty-seventh Annual Report of the Committee and Accounts for the Year ended 31 December 1980

### Committee

Since the date of the last report there have been five committee meetings. Messrs J. E. Gander, G. May, S. G. Pratt, S. Speed and L. D. Trenchard had agreed to join the Committee. The death of Mr F. S. Gander was reported with deep regret; Mr Gander had worked very hard for the Guild and would be sadly missed.

Applications for advice and assistance

In 1980 a considerable number of applications for advice and assistance were received. The help from Guild representatives and Branches throughout the country has been invaluable in maintaining close contact with people who have no relatives or near friends to turn to for financial advice or answers to personal problems.

Donations and legacies

To the members of the Institute who forwarded a voluntary donation of £1.50 to the Guild with their annual subscription we express our grateful thanks. We are also indebted to the King George's Fund for Sailors, J. S. Frazer Trustees, the Institute Branches for raising funds at the annual dinner dances and to many others for their generosity throughout the year, including the Institute for raising £2,452 at the Charity Ball.

A legacy of £68,642 from Mr Samuel Hoole and £4,500 from Mr A. J. Smith have helped to give the Guild accounts a healthy boost.

### Guild House

During the year five new residents have entered Guild House but unfortunately two had died. The death of Mrs Wilson in February and Mr Lockwood in July has reduced the number of permanent residents to nine. The flatlets were fully occupied and had been decorated recently. A record number of holiday guests had visited Guild House in 1980 which had not only helped financially with the ever-increasing cost of running the Guild House but had also given the existing residents hours of enjoyment in meeting new friends with common interests. It is proposed to continue to accept holiday guests in 1981.

### Accounts

The Revenue Account for 1980 shows a surplus of £14,310, an increase of £9,946 over 1979. This improvement is due to three items:

- 1. Additional income from Institute Members who donated £1.50 in addition to their annual Institute subscription.
- 2. Increase in surplus from Charity Ball.

3. Increase in dividend income, resulting mainly from Mr S. Hoole's legacy.

The administration increase is largely accounted for by increased salaries and by a computer charge of £1,179 for processing in connection with the £1.50 donation from Institute Members.

The market value of investments at 31 December 1980 was £219,425, that is £39,985 above book value.
