Forty-ninth Annual Report of the Committee and Accounts for the Year ended 30 September 1982

Committee

During the year the Committee held four meetings. Mr G. Fox was welcomed as a member of the Committee in December.

Applications for assistance

Advice and assistance has been given by the Committee to 35 new applications during the year and four new regular grants have been awarded. The continued help from Branch Representatives was very much appreciated by the Committee and also by the many people they had visited.

Guild House

The smooth running efficiency of the home continued under the direction of Mrs Fryer. One of the permanent residents who entered Guild House during the year was Mrs H. Taylor, daughter of Mr James Adamson, first member of the Institute.

Donations

The Committee would like to express their grateful thanks to the members of the Institute who have donated ± 1.50 with their annual subscription to the Guild. They would also like to thank the Branches for their generosity at annual dinner dances and the Trustees of J. S. Frazer deceased for their continued support.

Charity Ball

This had been organised for the first time by the Guild and had been a huge success resulting in a surplus of £2,545.

Accounts

These accounts are the first 12-months figures since the change of the financial year end to 30 September.

The revenue account shows a surplus of £6,118 after transferring a sum to reserve for Future Aid.

The cost of Quoted Securities at 30 September 1982 is £233,438, an increase of £53,776 over the previous year, which has arisen principally as a result of investing monies received from the Estate of the late Mr S. Hoole.

The Market Value of Quoted Securities at 30 September 1982 was £312,167.

The Guild House account showed an improvement in that only £497 had to be added from general funds to the Charity Ball surplus of £2,545 to meet the difference between income and expenditure of £3,042.
