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The following article from the Western Morning News of 19th November appeared on the day that 'Keyham', which so many of us knew, was transferred to the Dockyard Technical College. Not quite all of the old College was transferred for this purpose. On the same day, the Constructors Training Office was also officially opened. This took over the whole of the north end, including the library, north ante-room and dormitories above, which are now converted into excellent drawing offices and lecture rooms.
